Sahuaro High School has a variety of athletic and extracurricular activities in which students may participate. We encourage students to become involved in activities in order to enhance the high school experience.

CLEARANCE SLIPS

Sahuaro's interscholastic activities program is a competitive program for all boys and girls. Students interested in participating in an interscholastic activity must receive a "Clearance Slip" from the Cougar Activities Office. The Clearance Slip that the student received from the Activities Secretary is to be given to the coach or sponsor before the student is allowed to practice or participate.

To receive a Clearance Slip, the student must submit to the Sahuaro Activities Office, prior to the first practice, the **ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY PACKET**. Students and parents may pick up this packet in the Activities Office. Key items for clearance include the following:

STUDENTS MAY PURCHASE AN ATHLETIC PASS FOR \$30.00. THIS PASS ADMITS THE STUDENT TO ALL ATHLETIC EVENTS WHERE ADMISSION IS CHARGED. The insignia indicating that an athletic pass was purchased will be on your I.D. card. Please note that if you purchase an athletic pass after your first I.D. card is issued, you will need to get a new I.D. card and will be charged the \$3.00 replacement cost for a new I.D. card. This is a non-refundable fee.

Families may also purchase a Home Athletic Pass for \$100. This pass admits up to four people to any home athletic event. **PLEASE NOTE THAT THE HOME ATHLETIC PASS DOES NOT COVER CURRENT SHS STUDENTS. STUDENTS MUST PURCHASE A STUDENT PASS (SEE ABOVE).** Family members using a Home Athletic Pass must arrive at the event at the same time. Family Athletic Passes are not replaced if lost or stolen; however, a family may purchase another Home Athletic Pass.

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM ATHLETIC AND ACTIVITY EVENTS

Students are expected to use the transportation provided by the school and/or district to all away contests or events. With the approval of the coach or sponsor AND with the submission of the proper paperwork to the Activities Office, **parents may only transport their student or students may transport themselves to the contest or event declared on the paperwork.**

PARENTS TRANSPORTING THEIR CHILD:

1. Complete TUSD transportation request (TUSD 0828A)
2. Submit completed form to the Activities Office at least **ONE** day before the game or event.

STUDENTS TRANSPORTING THEMSELVES

1. Complete TUSD transportation request (TUSD 0828B).
2. Submit completed form to the Activities Office **AT LEAST THREE DAYS PRIOR TO THE CONTEST OR EVENT.**
3. The school also will require the following to be submitted with this form:
 - A. A copy of the driver’s license of the student
 - B. A copy of the student’s valid proof of auto insurance

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY FOR ACTIVITIES

1. TUSD's Academic Eligibility requirement is "NO PASS, NO PLAY" Students must pass all courses in which they are enrolled at the end of each nine-week period.
2. Students declared academically ineligible will be able to regain their eligibility at the 4 ½ progress report, if they are passing all classes in which they are currently enrolled.
3. Students must be enrolled in at least five classes during each nine weeks of participation.
4. Seniors who meet all graduation requirements only need to be enrolled in four classes.
5. All entering ninth grade students whose initial enrollment occurs at the beginning of the ninth grade, **and who passed all their classes the last quarter of eighth grade**, are eligible to participate. Ninth grade students who enroll after the beginning of the school year will be required to demonstrate passing grades in the required number of courses.
6. Grades for each student will be checked at 4½-week intervals in order to gain eligibility.
7. Students will be considered ineligible if they receive a grade of F, N, or I at the end of the first nine-week grading period; first semester; third-nine weeks; or second semester grading period. Ineligibility brought on by an Incomplete "I" will be eliminated at the time the grade of "I" becomes a passing grade. Students receiving an "I" must complete all work during the first two weeks of the next grading interval.
8. Students declared academically ineligible will be notified by Sponsor/Coach and directed to support services to help correct deficiencies.
9. Any credits that are received in correspondence courses or summer school courses, which count toward meeting graduation requirements and are approved by the school, may be used to maintain eligibility. These credits must be posted prior to the first day of classes each nine-week period.
10. Students transferring to a TUSD high school must meet eligibility requirements in order to participate in interscholastic activities

PARTICIPATION FEES

There is a \$50 participation fee for each sport/ fine art activity. There is \$150 cap for individuals per year, and \$200 maximum charge for families per school year.

(NO REFUNDS)

Students who are cut from a sport/activity or who quit a sport/activity as well as students who cannot participate in a sport/activity will not receive refund. All participation fees are an automatic tax credit. You will receive a receipt for you income tax.
