Dear Parents and Sahuaro Cougars:

Greetings to our new and returning students! I hope your summer has been enjoyable. We have been busy getting ready for the 2010-11 school year. The following information is very important and valuable in getting your student registered properly for school. I encourage you to carefully read and fill out the enclosed information **prior** to registering your student for school.

As many of you know, there was a new process that occurred in the spring of 2010 regarding registration. Students registered for classes based on 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> choices. Classes that did not fill due to lack of student interest were either reduced because of low numbers or cut due to lack of significant enrollment. As a District and School, we have gone through major changes and adjustments due to budget reductions and streamlining of classes for more efficiency. **Most classes are full and many classes are closed to new enrollments, due to class caps. We will not be able to address student schedule changes for different teachers, lunches, or special circumstances. The only schedule adjustments that will be made will be for seniors who need to address graduation requirements or for classes that were taken in summer school to address deficiencies.**

As you know, doing well in school takes hard work and your student must decide that school is an important priority in their life. Students who do well academically generally stay current with their class work, attends school everyday, and takes advantage of tutoring sessions offered by teachers. School events, clubs, and sports activities at our school are for all students. Students are encouraged to make an effort to get involved and participate in school activities. Sahuaro High School has a tradition of academic excellence, community partnerships, and extra- curricular activity opportunities. It is the expectation that students continue the Sahuaro tradition of excellence, be a part of the tradition. Even with changes due to budget reductions and less resources, Sahuaro High School is still committed to providing a quality education and activities.

I am looking forward to beginning the school year and welcoming students back. Sahuaro High School is committed to increasing student achievement and providing quality programs. Please have your student get involved in school activities and functions at the school. You are an important part of your student's academic success. Dear Sahuaro Parents/Guardians,

There are a few things I would like to update you on concerning your student's health needs for the 2010-2011 school year.

This year, the Pima County Health Department will **NOT** be holding their usual immunizations clinics at the Tucson Community Center as they have done in the past due to budget constraints. If you received a letter from my office stating your student is in need of an updated immunization for a Td/ Tdap, please take your student for this immunization as soon as possible. You do not have to wait until the due date as the Td/Tdap can be given now. Please take your student to their physician or one of the PCHD clinics. The eastside PCHD at 6920 E. Broadway (298-3888) will continue to hold immunizations clinics every Monday from 1-4 PM and every third Saturday from 9-12 PM for a fee of \$20. Again, if you received a letter reminding you of a needed immunization, check your records as your student may have already had the immunization, and if not, please see that your student has the updated vaccine and provide a copy of the immunization update to the health office at the beginning of the school year. Please feel free to mail a copy of the immunization update to me at the school, or you may fax a copy of your records at 731-7141. this year, all 9, 10, and 11<sup>th</sup> graders must have a record of having had the chicken pox or of having had the vaccine immunization. Having current immunizations is a state law, so please have your student's immunizations updated so we can be in state compliance.

Again, I must emphasize the importance of the green card being filled out completely with as many phone numbers and contacts as possible. The green card is a critical piece of information if your student should become ill or injured during the school day. We need a correct phone number to reach you or your emergency designee. Please update these phone numbers as they change and provide as many emergency phone numbers as possible. There are **two places** on the card for **your signature**. We need your signed **signature** for permission to give your child an **occasional** Tylenol or Ibuprofen during the school day. Your second **signature** provides permission to transport your child to the hospital in case of an emergency and we are unable to contact you.

**COUNSELORS AND SCHEDULE CHANGES:** Due to course additions or deletions, student schedules may have changed. Counselors will be available from Wednesday, August 4 – Tuesday, August 10. Hours for walk-ins are 8:00am-12:45pm. Seniors/New students to Sahuaro and any underclass student will see a counselor on a first come first serve basis. There will be a sign in sheet on the secretary's counter in the Counselors office for this. As student arrives, they sign in and wait their turn.

**STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARDS:** It is mandatory that all students obtain ID cards and have them *in their possession* at all times when on campus. Student IDs are used for a variety of important purposes, including issuing textbooks and class schedules, being admitted to school activities, processing lunch accounts, etc. Student IDs are issued free during schedule pick-up. There is a \$3.00 fee to replace a lost ID card or make changes to a student ID.

**TEXTBOOKS:** Textbooks are issued at no cost to students; however, **students are responsible for the books issued to them. Books returned at the end of the semester/year must be the same books issued to the student** (determined by scanned bar codes); otherwise, books are considered lost. Students are required to pay for lost/damaged books (average cost of \$75).

- Attend assigned Schedule Pick Up. ***Do not wait in line to pay fees.*** Your receipt will be attached to your child's schedule, which you will receive as soon as you arrive.

**STUDENT HANDBOOKS:** The Handbook (\$7) is designed to assist students in being organized and academically successful. All students are highly encouraged to purchase the Handbook which reflects updated information for the school year and will be referenced by most teachers.

**PE UNIFORMS:** PE students are required to dress in the approved PE uniform which consists of a red tee-shirt (plain or with “Sahuaro” imprint), blue shorts, tennis shoes, and socks. The cost to purchase uniforms through SHS is \$12 for shorts and \$10 for shirts. Uniforms may be purchased during schedule pick-up or in the bookstore at other times throughout the year.

**ATHLETIC PASSES:** Students may purchase a Student Athletic Pass (\$30) which provides free admission to all home athletic events throughout the school year. The Student Pass will be represented by an insignia on the student ID card. Students who purchase an athletic pass after their ID cards have been issued will need to purchase a new ID card to have it updated with the Athletic Pass insignia. There will be a \$3.00 charge for the replacement ID card.

Also available is a Family Athletic Pass (\$100) which provides free admission to all home athletic events for up to 4 members of the same family. *Family members using the Pass must arrive at the event together. Family Passes cannot be replaced if lost or stolen.* Please note that SHS students must obtain a Student Pass and will not be admitted as part of the Family Pass.

**STUDENT LOCKERS:** A \$5.00 fee will be assessed to students who wish to be assigned a hall locker. Hall lockers are the property of SHS. *Records of lock combinations are maintained by the office; general locker searches may be conducted by school administration at any time to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the campus.* Students in physical education classes may bring their own locks for their P.E. lockers or purchase a combination lock for \$5.00. All lockers should be properly locked when not in use. Lockers and combinations should not be shared with anyone.

**YEARBOOK PHOTOS:** Sam Pappas Photography (5315 East Broadway, Tucson) is the contracted studio for senior portraits. Seniors should contact Sam Pappas at 519-8081 to schedule their photo sessions. It is difficult to secure appointments once school has begun; therefore, seniors are encouraged to schedule their appointments before school begins in August. ***Seniors whose photos are not taken at Sam Pappas Photography by Friday, September 17, 2010, will not have their photos in the yearbook.*** Students are not required to purchase these photos.

All freshmen, sophomores, and juniors must have their yearbook photos taken by Inter-State Studio during schedule pickup. ***This photo is separate from the student ID photo and will appear in the yearbook, so students should dress accordingly.*** There is no charge for having these photos taken; however, purchase information will be available for those wishing to purchase their photos. Photo re-take information will be available during daily announcements. Questions may also be addressed to Inter-State Studio at 744-8746.

**YEARBOOKS:** Advance purchase of yearbooks (\$80) will be offered beginning at schedule pick-up. Yearbooks purchased after March 1 will be \$85 and those purchased after the book’s release will be \$90. *Interested students are strongly encouraged to pre-order their yearbooks.*

**STUDENT PARKING AND VEHICLES:** Students who drive to school must purchase a parking pass (\$6). Passes may be purchased during schedule pick-up and must be visibly displayed at all times during the school day. *Those who begin driving to school after the beginning of the school year are still required to purchase a parking pass* in the finance office. To obtain a parking pass, students must provide proof of insurance, vehicle make/model, and license plate number. Students may park in the *north parking lot only* and may not park in handicapped areas (unless applicable), visitor parking spaces, or in no-parking zones. Citations may be issued for parking violations. *It is a privilege to park on school grounds; privileges may be revoked when violations occur.*

## INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

Sahuaro has a variety of athletic and extracurricular activities, and students are encouraged to participate to enhance their high school experience. Parent orientation meetings are held prior to the start of each competition season. These meetings provide parents with an overview of program guidelines, parent and athlete expectations and an opportunity to meet with the individual coaches/sponsors. SHS participates in the Pursuing Victory With Honor program, which you will learn more about at the parent meetings. *All coaches/sponsors/staff, students, parents/guardians, and spectators are expected to uphold the philosophies of this program while attending interscholastic activities both on and off the SHS campus.*

**Fall:** August - November      Cross Cntry, Football, Golf, Swimming, Girls Volleyball, Spiritline

**Winter:** November - Feb.      Basketball, Soccer, Wrestling, Spiritline

**Spring:** February - May      Baseball, Softball, Tennis, Track, Boys Volleyball, Spiritline

***PARTICIPATION FEES:*** There is a **\$50 participation fee** for each sport/performing arts activity in which a student participates; however, participation fees are capped at \$150 per individual and \$200 per family per school. Please note that sports and performing arts fees cannot be combined to reach the cap. Participation fees are **non-refundable**, even if the student becomes ineligible, gets hurt or quits the activity. Students must submit their fees within two weeks of the activity's first day of practice/ try-out period or the student will be ineligible to continue to participate. Fees for advanced level performing arts classes (Band, Orchestra, Jazz Band, vocal ensembles, Drama, and Choir) are payable during Summer Registration/Schedule Pick-Up. Fees for DECA and Skills USA will be required later in the semester for participating students. Student managers/trainers do not pay a fee.

Participation fees qualify for Arizona Tax Credit. Students who pay fees will automatically be provided with an appropriate receipt for tax purposes. **Since these fees are a Tax Credit, the fees are non-refundable.**

***PACKETS:*** Packets for athletics and performing arts activities are available in the Activities Office. The following forms must be completed and on file in the Activities Office **BEFORE** an athlete can attend practice:

- ✓ **Physical Form** (signed by both physician and parent)
  - ✓ **Emergency Card**
  - ✓ **Parent Permission Card**
  - ✓ **Birth Certificate** (if student has never played a sport at Sahuaro before)
  - ✓ **Report Card** (4<sup>th</sup> quarter grades for incoming freshmen; last semester grades for transfer students)
- (Performing arts packets include just the Parent Permission and Emergency Card)*

***ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY:*** Sahuaro adheres to TUSD's "**No Pass, No Play**" academic eligibility requirements summarized as follows:

- Students must pass all courses in which they are enrolled at the end of each 9-week period.
- Students declared academically ineligible may regain eligibility at the next 4 ½ week progress report.
- Students must be enrolled in at least 5 classes during each 9 weeks of participation; seniors 4 classes.
- Approved summer school credits may be used to maintain eligibility.
- Transfer students must meet eligibility requirements in order to participate in interscholastic activities.

## ARIZONA TAX CREDIT

Have you taken advantage of the tax credit (joint returns \$400/ \$200 single) given to Arizona Taxpayers who contribute to public schools? Any Arizona taxpayer can make a contribution. Activities fees paid to the school count towards your tax credit total.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

**FRESHMEN HEARING SCREENINGS:** Freshmen are encouraged to have their hearing screened during their assigned schedule pick-up times on August 4 and 5. Screenings will be conducted in the health office by the school nurse. Signs providing directions to the health office will be posted on campus.

**GRADE REPORTS:** Grade reports are issued every 4 ½ weeks and include grades, attendance, citizenship, and pertinent comments from individual teachers. Final grades are credited at the end of the quarter for physical education, health, and special education classes. Final grades for all other courses are credited at the end of each semester. Grade report dates are as follows:

**GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:** Students are required to take 6 classes each semester. Any deviation requires approval of the principal; questions may be directed to the Assistant Principal of Curriculum. *All students must pass the Arizona Instrument to Measure Standards (AIMS) test in order to graduate.* Graduation requirements established by the State of Arizona are as follows:

**CONFERENCE PERIODS:** Conference periods are an integral part of a student's regular schedule and can be mandatory if a student's progress is not satisfactory. Conference time is intended to assist students in making up work missed during excused absences, working on library assignments, making up tests, or doing other tasks that allow them to improve their academic performance. Logs reflecting conference attendance are maintained by individual teachers. Students who are on campus during conference periods are not permitted to leave campus and must report to a classroom or to study hall in the cafeteria.

**STUDENT ATTENDANCE:** Sahuaro High School adheres to TUSD Student Attendance Policies JE and JE-R which can be located at [www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JE.html](http://www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JE.html) and at [www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JE-R.html](http://www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JE-R.html) for review. The basic components of these policies are as follows:

- All students must remain on the school campus during the entire school day unless parents provide notification prior to the leave.
- A Parent/Guardian is expected to notify the school on or before the day of the absence/tardy. State law mandates that the school record reasons for all student absences; therefore, all messages *must* include parent name, student name, date, time, and reason for absence. If it is not possible to notify the school prior to the absence, the school *must receive notice within 48 hours* after the student returns to school; otherwise, the absence will be considered unexcused.
- Absences for illness, doctor/dentist appointments, death in the family, and required court appearance for student, religious holidays/purposes, and school activities/business shall be excused.
- **Students who accumulate 10 or more unexcused absences will *not* receive credit for the classes in which those absences accrued.** In such cases, students may appeal the grade decision as outlined in Policies JE and JE-R above.

### ***To report student absences, contact the Attendance Office at 731-7100***

Sahuaro uses a phone master to call the home telephone numbers of its students for a variety of reasons including emergency situations, teacher contacts, updated information, and attendance concerns. The phone master does not override blocked phone numbers. *Parents should be aware that blocking the school phone number will not allow them to receive important calls and information from Sahuaro. Please also notify the school Attendance Office of any mailing address or telephone number changes occurring during the school year.*

#### **TUSD AND SAHUARO HIGH SCHOOL POLICIES**

**CAMPUS ENVIRONMENT:** All students receive copies of the Guidelines for Rights and Responsibilities. Students are expected to read and understand the contents of these guidelines which are intended to create a positive and safe environment for learning and teaching at Sahuaro. When required, students will be referred for discipline to an administrator.

The following violations may result in long-term suspension or expulsion, even for a first offense: Aggravated assault with or without a weapon; extortion; robbery; sexual misconduct; possession and/or use of illegal and dangerous substances (including alcohol and paraphernalia); setting off a fire alarm; arson; possession and/or concealment of a weapon; sale or distribution of controlled legal (prescription) or illegal substances; bomb threat; commission of any felony as defined by state law.

Knives, leathermen, and other pocket tools are not allowed on campus. Students may be suspended for up to 9 days for Fighting on school grounds or using abusive language including, but not limited to, obscenities, vulgarity, profanity, or racial/ethnic/gender/orientation slurs will also result in disciplinary action.

*To ensure safety, the campus periodically practices the Emergency Plan that involves two separate procedures: a “lock down” and an “evacuation plan.”*

**CLOSED CAMPUS:** Sahuaro is a closed campus, meaning that students must remain on campus for the entire school day. Lunch passes will not be issued and parents cannot excuse their students for lunch. Students who leave campus without permission will face disciplinary action. *Early dismissal students may not return to campus until the end of the school day.*

**STUDENT DELIVERIES:** SHS strives to provide an educational environment that minimizes distractions and promotes successful learning. ***Deliveries during the instructional day are disruptive to maintaining that environment and will be turned away throughout the entire school year.*** Such deliveries include, but are not limited to, flowers, balloons, candy, and food. Students should also be organized and plan properly to minimize disruptions during the school day (i.e. – delivery of forgotten homework, lunch money, etc).

**RECREATIONAL ITEMS:** Skateboards, skates, and bicycles are **not** to be ridden or used within the fenced areas of the campus *at any time*. Students will park bicycles in the designated bike racks located to the east of the administration building. *Students are responsible for securing their own bicycles.*

**CAMPUS VISITORS:** All visitors are required to sign in at the attendance office to receive a visitor's pass which must be visible throughout the duration of the visit. Visitors should sign out and return the pass upon conclusion of the visit. *Parents desiring to visit/observe a class must coordinate their visit with the teacher or an administrator at least 48 hours prior to the visit. Student visitors are not allowed on campus at any time during the school day.*

Non-Sahuaro students who wish to attend Sahuaro events (other than paid-admission sports events) must apply for a guest pass in advance at the activities office. *Guests who have not been pre-approved and received a guest pass will not be admitted to the event. Under no circumstances will persons 21 years of age or older be approved for a guest pass.*

**DRESS CODE:** SHS requires that students adhere to the TUSD dress code. While allowing for expression of individual tastes, student dress must not interfere with student safety or become a distraction to the educational process. SHS requests that parents support this philosophy by monitoring school attire and encouraging students to "dress for success." *Inappropriately-dressed students will be required to change their clothing and may face disciplinary action.* Please visit [www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JICA.html](http://www.tusd1.org/contents/govboard/SectJ/JICA.html) for details regarding dress code and appropriate attire.

**LIMITS OF LIABILITY:** Students who drive to school, and their parents/guardians, should recognize that Tucson Unified School District specifically disclaims any responsibility, expressed or implied, to protect against the loss of, or damage to, vehicles or their contents. No employee or agent may alter or expand the District's liability orally or otherwise. Individual decisions to park on school grounds shall constitute acknowledgement and acceptance of this condition on the individual's right to use the school's parking facility.

**ELECTRONIC DEVICES:** Except for during the student's scheduled lunch period, electronic devices (i.e. – cell phones, iPods, etc) may not be activated during regular school hours. Students not adhering to this policy may face sanctions. Additionally, SHS and TUSD will not be responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of any electronic devices brought on campus.

## BELL SCHEDULE

School will begin on Monday, August 16, 2010. Although school starts at 7:30 each morning, the bell schedule varies depending on circumstances.
