Mr. Christ, our principal for years, has accepted a new position. The following is his letter to the Secrist community:

Dear Secrist parent,

March 7, 2011

As many of you know, I have accepted an offer to take over the position of Director of Resource Development, which is the TUSD district-level position responsible for grant writing and oversight. I consider it an honor to have been appointed to this position, and I look forward to taking on the challenges that it represents. I have a real mix of feelings regarding this step; I have established strong friendships and caring professional relationships with many staff members, parents and children in the Secrist community, and I was looking forward to continuing my work here. When the superintendent's leadership team approached me about the position, I had hoped it might be possible to remain at Secrist as your principal until after the administration of AIMS, but they made it clear that there was an urgent need for someone to take on the Director's duties fairly quickly because of both the number and the size of grants from which our district children benefit. 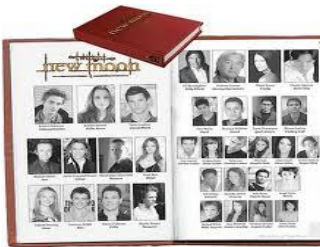

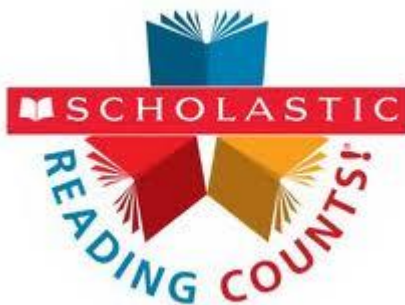
We Made It! Disneyland Bound!

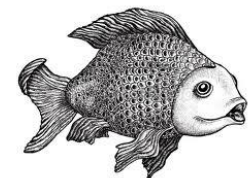
