The Reptile Show

Do you like reptiles? If you do last weekend was the 9th Annual Tucson Reptile and Amphibian Show. This year there were thousands of reptiles from everywhere around the world including Africa, Asia, South America, and Central America. All these reptiles were sold or put on display by approximately 100 different vendors.

The Phoenix Herpetological Society put about 50 poisonous snakes and other reptiles on display. Their displays included a King Cobra, a Gabon Viper, a Saw Scale Viper, and a Fer-de-lance, They also had an alligator, named, "Tuesday." They also had a Water Monitor Lizard, named "Rowdy," and an African Spur Tortoise that children could pet and take pictures with.

At the show there were 6 presentations educating people about reptiles and amphibians. Some of the presentations were on topics like: Reptiles and Amphibians of Arizona, Reptiles and Amphibians of Ecuador, Metabolic Bone Disease, Reptile Parasites, and How to Breed and Care for Spiny Tailed Iguanas.

This year 7,000 people came to the show. Thousands of children and adults left with the reptile or amphibian they've always wanted. Ms. Dickason, an 8th grade science teacher here at Ft. Lowell-Townsend left with her new Ball Python, Matilda, and Ms. Tenace, a 6th grade science teacher left with her new Bearded Dragon.

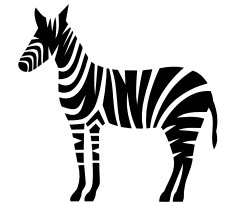
Band and Orchestra notes:
