Judging will take place on Friday, 3/4 by NJHS. Judging will be based on creativity with **AIMS topics, Math/Reading/Writing**.

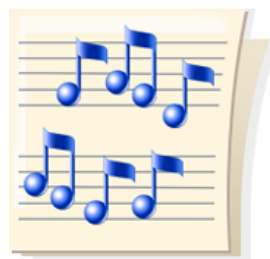
There will be one middle school class winner and one elementary class winner based on **6th period for Middle**.
